DISTRICT 3800 Rotary Academy RY 2011 - 2012 Edition

In RY 2010-2011 when he was still District Governor Elect, the current District Governor Raffy Garcia asked his fellow Pasig Rotarian PP Bobby Paterno to look into reviving the Rotary Academy which he had originally designed for the district several years ago. RC San Juan del Monte CP Marilou Co was designated Senior Deputy Governor for Special Training and also Rotary Academy Executive Director. These two, with the aid of PDGs Edison Ang, Efren de Guzman, Fabie Enriquez and Pepe Peralta, and senior Rotarians who had been Executive Directors of the Academy, particularly, RC Marikina South PP Jun Angeles and RC Metro Marikina PP Bobby Rosadia, designed and organized three seminars to be carried out during the first semester of the year 2011-2012: (1) Rotary 101: Basics of Rotary; (2) Rotary 102: Rotary's Current Strategic Plan Priorities; and (3) Rotary 103: Leadership, Motivation, and the Art of Public Speaking.

All were designed as half-day seminars, particularly Saturday afternoons 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. As of mid-October, all three have been undertaken at least once.



Rotary 101: Basics of Rotary is designed for beginner Rotarians and introduces participants to the essentials of Rotary including the basic values, expectations and activities usually encompassed by what are known as the five Avenues of Service: Club, Vocational, Community, New Generations and International Service. So far this semester, Rotary 101 has been done three times, (1) on August 13, 2011 for the clubs of Caloocan, Malabon, Navotas and Valenzuela (Zones 1,2,3), at the Social Center of Valenzuela City with the RCs Kalookan North and Valenzuela as host clubs; (2) on August 20, 2011 for the various clubs of Rizal (Zones 5,9) at the Ynares Center in Antipolo City, with the RCs Teresa and Suburban East Rizal

as host clubs; and (3) on October 1, 2011 for the clubs of Marikina and Pasig (Zones 4,6) in the Department of Education's Bulwagan ng Karunungan in Pasig City, with the RCs Metro Marikina and Pasig South as host clubs. The speakers so far have been PDG Edison Ang, PDG Fabie Enriquez, PDG Efren de Guzman, SDG Marilou Co, DDG Bobby Rosadia, and PP Bobby Paterno. A fourth and final rendition of Rotary 101 this semester is scheduled for November 12, 2011, this time for all the clubs of San Juan and Mandaluyong (Zones 7,8), to be hosted by the RCs San Juan West and Mandaluyong North.



Rotary 102: Rotary's Current Strategic Plan Priorities is designed for present club officers and leaders. It is designed to enable club leaders to participate in the strategic planning that has been carried out by R.I. and to encourage them to work towards these identified priorities and goals in leading their clubs. R.I strategic planning has involved Rotary leaders from all over the world over a number of years and it has identified 3 strategic priorities: (1) Support and strengthen clubs; (2) Focus and increase humanitarian service; (3) Enhance public image and awareness. And 16 quantifiable goals have been specified under these 3 priorities. These goals and priorities are the subject of Rotary 102, which has been



carried out only once so far on September 17, 2011 for the clubs of Caloocan, Malabon, Navotas, Valenzuela and Marikina (Zones 1,2,3,4) in DepEd's Bulwagan ng Karunungan in Pasig City, with the RCs North Bay East and Marikina South as host clubs. Speakers so far have been DDG Bobby Rosadia, SDG Manny Reyes, and PDG Mickey Ortigas.

Two more renditions of Rotary 102 are scheduled: (1) on November 26, 2011, for the clubs of Rizal (Zones 5,9) with the RCs Lakeshore Rizal and Cainta as host clubs, during which the speakers will be SDG Jun Angeles, PDG Mac Hermoso and DDG Benjie Liboro; and (2) on December 3, 2011, for the clubs of Pasig, San Juan and Mandaluyong (Zones 6,7,8), with the RCs Pasig Sunrise and San Juan as host clubs. DDS Augie Soliman, PDG Benny Ricafort, and SDG Willie Caballa

will be the speakers.

Rotary 103: Leadership, Motivation and the Art of Public Speaking is designed for Rotarians aspiring for leadership in their clubs and beyond in the district level. It was held only once this semester on October 15, 2011, at the Quezon City Sports Club and open to all clubs of District 3800. It was hosted by the Rotary Club of Navo-

tas, and featured experts in their field: PDG and Republic of the Philippines Secretary of Communications Sonny Coloma and Baby Luat, a Governor of Toastmasters International, a professional trainor in public speaking.

It was held last Oct. 1 at the DepEd building in Pasig. RA 101 is specially geared towards newly inducted Rotarians. The subject matters were carefully designed not only to inform but also to encourage Rotarians to enjoy and take full advantage of their membership in Rotary.


the Ten Pin Bowling tournament last week. That is good Rotary!

This year is another remarkable year as 61 youth leaders gathered for the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) last October 21-23, 2011 at Pranjetto Hills Resort and Conference Center in Tanay Rizal.

Inspired by the Rotary Year's theme, "Reach Within to Embrace Humanity," the core principle of RYLA 2011states that today's youth leaders must know what it takes to create change in the world. They must understand that in order to influence, they must first learn to reach within themselves before they can spread the goodwill to the society through acts of service. The program consists of four levels:

Level 1 – Reaching Yourself (Value of Self-Awareness in Discovering Leadership Potentials)

Level 2 – Reaching the Family (Realizing the Importance of Family in Character and Community Building)

Level 3 – Reaching the Community (Understanding the Principles of Volunteerism)

Level 4 – Reaching the Society (Introduction of Rotary International and the Six Areas of Focus)

Experienced and competent speakers like Mr. Arcy Garcia (Freelance Trainer), Mr. Ricky Sarthou (CCF Pastor), Ms. Lourdes Vindollo (Writer), Ms. Lana Parungao (certified trainer of the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People) and Ms. Paola Deles (People Power Volunteer for Reform) were invited to share their knowledge and skills to the youth participants. Rotarians like PDG Bimbo Salazar, PP Floro Francisco, Rtn. Alex Asuncion and Rtn. Kat Paradina also shared their expertise to the youth. District Governor Raffy Garcia also graced the said occasion and inspired the future leaders through his motivational speech.

The culminating activity was the Rotary Ad Congress, where participants were grouped into six representing the six areas of focus of Rotary International Service Projects. The task was to create creative radio, TV or print advertisements to promote Water and Sanitation, Maternal and Child Care, Literacy, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Peace and Conflict and Economic Development. The participants showcased fantastic group presentations and presented very promising ideas for future Rotary projects.
