MID-YEAR REVIEW 2014 Valle Verde Country Club, Pasig City

On January 24, 2014, the District Mid-Year review was held at the Valle Verde Country Club and it was hosted by the Rotary Club of San Juan West. PP Augie Soliman, the Chair of the District Mid-Year Review, organized the program such that all participants, especially the First Club Presidents, will be aware of the current situation of the District, including the clubs relative to the District Thrust and RI Thrust.

First Class Governor Louie Ticman, in his message to the participants, reiterated that all clubs should aspire for the Presidential Citation to be given by RI President Burton. He encourages the clubs to still strive better to attain their club goals for this Rotary year so that we can achieve the goals for our District Thrust. PDG Benny Ricafort was invited to give inspirational message to the clubs by discussing the leadership needed by the clubs at this mid-point of the Rotary year.

PDG Jun Farcon, being the Chair of District Membership Development, presented the summary of all the clubs' performances in managing membership growth. Likewise, a summary of Zonal achievements and the District current situation of the Membership growth was shown with vis-à-vis the district goals and the past year performance. All zones reported positive growth in membership and early achievers were recognized as follows: Caloocan Monumento, Marikina North, San Mateo, Suburban East Rizal, Taytay, Morong, Angono, Pasig North, San Juan, San Jun Del Monte, San Juan West, Mandaluyong Central, Mandaluyong Uptown and Greater Mandaluyong.

Top 15 clubs in Membership recruitment are: 1) San Juan West, 2) Mandaluyong Uptown, 3) Caloocan Monumento, 4) Greater Mandaluyong, 5) Pasig North, 6) Morong, 7) San Mateo, 8) San Juan Del Monte, 9) Marikina North, 10) Angono, 11) Mandaluyong Central, 12) Metro Cainta, 13) San Juan, 14) Suburban East Rizal, 15) Taytay.

The Chair of the Annual Giving, PP Manny Reyes, reported that our district has obtained, so far, an achievement of 60% from the target of District goal, as of January 24, 2014. From the Fund goal of US\$ 330,000, set by our District Governor, we now have US\$ 198,346.10 as TRF contribution from our Rotarians in the District.

Early Achievers of our Annual Fund Goals are the following clubs: Navotas, North Bay East, Sampaguita Grace Park, Valenzuela East, Valenzuela West, Teresa, Pasig North, Pasig Sunrise, Greater Mandaluyong, Mandaluyong and Mandaluyong West. There are club which registered already as 100% Sustaining Members Club in TRF. These are the following clubs: North Bay East, Rizal Centro, Suburban East Rizal and San Juan.

The Service Project report was discussed by PDG Efren De Guzman, being the chair of Service Projects. All the clubs achievements versus the Club goals were shown in the presentation. PP Joel Guevarra, the District Communication Officer presented the Rotary Club Central. He discussed the importance of logging-in by the clubs to this portal and its uses for club management. Furthermore, he showed the clubs which are already using the Rotary Club Central and their data input. The actual achievements of the clubs versus the goals were shown in order that the participants will appreciate better the beauty of engaging into Rotary Club Central.

Rizal Provincial Hospital System-Angono Annex, Angono, Rizal

Last January 19-24, 2014, the Rizal Rotary Clubs Zone 5A and Zone 5B hosted a Medical, Surgical and Dental Medical Mission at Rizal Provincial Hospital System-Angono Annex with Rotary Club of Angono and Rotary Club of Suburban East Rizal as lead clubs.

The week before the project starts so many problems arises but the cooperation of all the clubs in Rizal and friends from other clubs, the project was a success. Thanks to the missioners coming from Kansas City, Missouri, USA composed of members from Philippine Medical Society and Philippine Nurses Association of Greater Kansas City with help of local doctors coming from Rizal Zones A and B and other medical practitioners invited by PMS has a total of fifty six (56),

not counting local volunteers like nurses and other medical aids who willingly served our less fortunate brethren.

The mission was able to treat one thousand seven hundred (1,700) out patient/clinic, approximately 200 major and minor operations and approximately fifty (50) dental patients.

The missioners aside from the medical, surgical and dental missions, they also brought along medical equipment that fill the 40-foot container to the hilt. We have to acknowledge the Municipality of Cainta and some businessmen from the town in helping defray the cost on taxes and duties of the equipment.
